The 5th International Monika-Sikorska-Wojtacha Piano Competition Wieliczka 2019, Poland Rules

- 1. The Organizer of the 5th International Monika Sikorska-Wojtacha Piano Competition is the Music School Complex in Wieliczka, Poland.
- 2. The aim of the Competition is to confront the artistic achievements of students of music schools, exchange pedagogical experiences between teachers and popularize piano music of the 20th and 21st century from around the world, and in particular the work of Polish composers.
- 3. The Competition will take place on **May 29 June 1, 2019** at the Music School Complex in Wieliczka, Rynek Górny 6, 32-020 Wieliczka.
- 4. The Competition is open to students of 1st and 2nd degree music schools. It will be divided into four age categories:
 - category I born in 2008 and younger
 - category II born in 2006 and younger
 - category III born in 2003 and younger
 - category IV born in 2000 and younger
- 5. Winners of the first prizes of previous editions of the Competition may not take part in the same category.
- 6. The Jurors' students are not allowed to participate in the Competition.
- 7. The International Jury will be chaired by Prof. dr hab. Andrzej Pikul (Academy of Music in Krakow).
- 8. The Jury awards prizes and distinctions and may award the Grand Prix for a participant with outstanding and distinctive artistic individuality.
- 9. The decisions of the Jury are final, indisputable and irrevocable.
- 10. The Competition will end with the Laureates' Concert combined with the ceremony of awarding prizes and diplomas.
- 11. All laureates of the Competition are obliged to participate in the Laureates' Concert.
- 12. The Organizers of the Competition predict Workshops conducted by Members of the Competition Jury (after its completion). Active participants of the Workshops will be selected during the Competition.
- 13. Applications should be sent by **April 30, 2019** electronically using the form provided on the school website: www.smuzwieliczka.edu.pl. The Competition Office will decide about participation in the Competition after accepting the repertoire sent in the application.

- 14. In the participant's application, please specify the duration of the presentation not exceeding:
 - in category I 10 minutes,
 - in category II 12 minutes,
 - in category III 15 minutes,
 - in category IV 35 minutes.
- 15. If the time limit is exceeded, the Jury may interrupt the performance.
- 16. The pieces can be performed in any order. The program must be performed by heart with the exception of the 20th and 21st century compositions containing aleatory episodes.
- 17. The Organizer asks to use the original music sheets as well as to make them available for inspection by the Jury.
- 18. The order of the participants' presentations will be determined by the Organizer. Information on the date of the audition and acoustic rehearsals, including the rehearsal on the competition instrument, will be placed on the website of the Music School Complex in Wieliczka.
- 19. The Organizer reserves the right to change the schedule of the Competition.
- 20. The entrance fee should be paid enclosing the note "Konkurs Pianistyczny" to the following bank account:

Participants from abroad pay a fee of 120 PLN on-site, the day of arrival.

- 21. Confirmation of payment (participants from Poland only) should be sent with the application until **April 30, 2019**.
- 22. In the event of resignation from participation in the Competition, the fee will not be refunded.
- 23. Participants cover the costs of travel, accommodation and meals on their own.
- 24. The Organizer reserves the possibility of free recording and release of material from the auditions and the Laureates' Concert.

CATEGORY III:

- 1. A polyphonic Baroque piece.
- 2. Freely chosen study or a virtuoso piece.
- 3. Freely chosen piece of the twentieth, twenty-first century composer, with the exception of pieces written by post-Romantic composers.

CATEGORY IV:

- 1. A polyphonic Baroque piece.
- 2. Freely chosen study or a virtuoso piece.
- 3. Freely chosen Classical or Romantic form.
- 4. Freely chosen piece of the twentieth, twenty-first century composer, with the exception of pieces written by post-Romantic composers.

Comments to the program:

- 1. Individual elements of the program should be chosen to show the full range of skills of the participant.
- 2. Prof. dr hab. Andrzej Pikul awards the Special Prize for best performance of the "Bagatelles" by Krystyna Moszumańska-Nazar.

- 4. Under postromantic compositions term is meant the compositions of living and composing composers in the twentieth century, whose expression, harmony, texture is or refers to romantic aesthetics (eg works of IJ Paderewski, early opuses of works by K.
