The 7th International "Vivaldi 345" Violin and Viola Competition

Rule book

- The 7th International "Vivaldi 345" Violin and Viola Competition is organized by the Music School Complex in Wieliczka, address: 32-020 Wieliczka, Rynek Górny 6, Poland; e-mail: sekretariat@smuzwieliczka.edu.pl.
 - The competition office and auditions will be held in the Aula "Sztygarówka", at 2 Dembowskiego Street.
- 2. The competition will be held in two categories: violin and viola (for the first time).
- 3. The competition will be held in two stages: the first stage online, and the second stage stationary.
- 4. The competition for the violin category, group I is a single-stage competition conducted online.
- 5. The competition for the remaining groups in the violin and viola category is held in two stages: stage I online, stage II stationary.
- 6. Auditions of the first stage (online) will start on March 1, 2023. The results of online auditions will be announced no later than March 20, 2023 on the website www.smuzwieliczka.edu.pl
- 7. Competition auditions of the 2nd stage will take place from April 13 to April 15, 2023.
- 8. The competition in the violin category will be divided into four age groups:
 - The 1st Group participants born after 31.12.2013 (I or II year of study),
 - The 2nd Group participants born between 01.01.2012 and 31.12.2013 (III or IV year of study),
 - The 3rd Group participants born between 01.01.2010 a 31.12.2011 (V or VI year of study),
 - The 4th Group participants born between 01.01.2008 a 31.12.2009 (VII or VIII year of study).
 - All individual cases will be settled by the organizers.
- 9. The competition in the viola category will be divided into three age groups:
 - The 1st Group students of the 3rd and 4th grades of the 6-year cycle and the 8-year cycle and the 2nd grade of the 4-year cycle of the 1st degree music school.
 - The 2nd Group students of the 5th and 6th grades of the 6-year cycle and 8-year cycle and 3rd and 4th grades of the 4-year cycle of the 1st degree music school.
 - The 3rd Group students of the 7th and 8th grades of the 8-year cycle of the 1st degree music school and 1st and 2nd grade students of the 2nd degree music school.
- 10. The Jury appointed by the organizer sets the rules for scoring, distribution of diplomas and awards.
- 11. The decisions of the Jury are final.
- 12. In the 1st age group in the violin category, special awards will be granted, while in the remaining age groups in the violin and viola category places and distinctions, including the Grand Prix.
- 13. Grand Prix Winner and Winners of the 1st Prize of previous editions of the competition are excluded from participation in the same age group. Prize-Winner of the younger group in previous competition is allowed to participate in the older group.
- 14. Participants will perform in alphabetical order, starting from randomly chosen contestant.
- 15. The program must be performed by heart, except for the concerto for two violins.
- 16. Stage I online for all groups how to make and share the recording:

- 1) The video recording for the competition must be done horizontally. The film should show the full body of the performer, his playing and posture. It is not allowed to interfere with the recording of a single piece (the piece should be made in one shot, without editing). It is allowed to use external microphones.
- 2) The recording of two tracks should be sent **by February 28, 2023** as one video file placed exclusively on YouTube, setting its status as non-public. It is allowed to record two tracks in two shots merged into one file.
- 3) In the title of the film, enter the name and surname of the participant and the age group.
- 4) In the description of the film one should write 7th International Violin and Viola Competition "Vivaldi 345", name and surname of the performer and accompanist, the group in which he performs, the program performed.
- 17. Stage II will take place in the Music School Complex in Wieliczka in Aula "Sztygarówka" at 2 Dembowskiego Street.
- 18. Participants should appear at the Competition's office no later than 60 minutes before the planned time of the performance.
- 19. The auditions will end with the Prize-Winners' Concert and the Awards Ceremony.
- 20. Participation in Prize-Winners' Concert is obligatory for the awarded participants and accompanists.
- 21. The winners of the Grand Prix and the 1st Prizes will perform during the Prize-Winners' Concert the concerto by Antonio Vivaldi or Johann Sebastian Bach in the violin category with the accompaniment of a chamber orchestra; in the viola category a selected concert with piano accompaniment.
- 22. The entry fee for all groups 150 PLN should be paid by February 28, 2023, enclosing the note "Vivaldi 345"- name and surname of the participant, to the following bank account:

- 23. Participants' applications, recordings for the first stage of the competition and confirmation of the entry fee should be sent **by February 28, 2023** in electronic form using the form available at www.smuzwieliczka.edu.pl
- 24. In case of the candidate's resignation, the entry fee will not be refunded.
- 25. Participants cover the costs of travel, accommodation and meals on their own.
- 26. The organizers provide an accompanist for participants from abroad. The participant is then obliged to send the score of the accompaniment along with the application form.
- 27. The organizers reserve the right of free registration and release material from the auditions and the Prize-Winners' Concert.

Category - violin

The 1st Group

- 1. Freely chosen miniature accompanied by the piano, with the exclusion of cyclical forms. The work of the Polish composer is welcome.
- 2. The 1st or 3rd movement of the concerto chosen from:
 - A. Vivaldi Concerto in G major Op. 7 No. 2
 - F. Küchler Concertino in D major Op. 15 in Vivaldi's style
 - F. Küchler Concertino in G major Op. 11
 - G. Perlmann Concertino in A minor
 - O. Rieding Concerto in B minor Op. 35
 - O. Rieding Concerto in G major Op. 34
 - A. Komarowski Concertino in G major
 - K. Krejci Concertino in B minor
 - J. Stasica Concertino in G major

It is permissible to perform another concerto of Vivaldi but its level of difficulty must be the same or higher than the level of difficulty of the concertos suggested above.

The 2nd Group

Stage I

- 1. Freely chosen etude or caprice
- 2. Miniature with piano accompaniment, excluding cyclical forms. (a piece by a composer from the participant's country is welcome)

Stage II

The 1st or 3rd movement of the concerto chosen from:

- A. Vivaldi Concerto in G major Op.3 No.3 RV 310
- A. Vivaldi Concerto in G minor No.52 RV 334
- A. Vivaldi Concerto in A minor Op. 3 No.6 RV 356
- A. Vivaldi Concerto in G minor Op. 4 No.6 RV 316

It is permissible to perform the 1st or 3rd movement of the concerto from the 3rd group.

The 3rd Group

Stage I

- 1. Freely chosen etude or caprice.
- 2. Miniature accompanied by the piano, with the exclusion of cyclical forms. (a piece by a composer from the participant's country is welcome)

Stage II

The 1st or 2nd and 3rd movement of the concerto chosen from:

- A. Vivaldi Concerto in A major No. 51 RV 345
- A. Vivaldi Concerto in E major Op. 8 No. 1 RV 269 (Spring)
- A. Vivaldi Concerto in G minor Op. 12 No. 1 RV 317
- A. Vivaldi Concerto in E major Op. 3 No. 12 RV 265
- J.S. Bach Concerto in A minor, BWV 1041
- J.S. Bach Concerto in E major, BWV 1042

The 4th Group

Stage I

- 1. Freely chosen etude or caprice.
- 2. Miniature accompanied by the piano, with the exclusion of cyclical forms. (a piece by a composer from the participant's country is welcome)

Stage II

- 1. The 1st or 2nd and 3rd movement of the concerto chosen from:
 - A. Vivaldi Concerto in E major Op. 8 No. 1 RV 269 (Spring)
 - A. Vivaldi Concerto in G minor Op. 8 No. 2 RV 315 (Summer)
 - A. Vivaldi Concerto in F major Op. 8 No. 3 RV 293 (Autumn)
 - A. Vivaldi Concerto in F minor Op. 8 No. 4 RV 297 (Winter)
 - J. S. Bach Concerto in A minor, BWV 1041
 - J.S. Bach Concerto in E major, BWV 1042
- 2. A. Vivaldi Concerto for two violins in A minor RV 522 L'Estro Armonico Op. 3 no.8, I movement violin I solo part. The concerto can be performed from score. The competition participant will perform the concerto together with a violinist invited by the organizer.

Category - viola

- 1. Freely chosen etude or caprice.
- 2. Miniature accompanied by the piano, with the exclusion of cyclical forms.

Stage II

The 1st or 3rd movement of the concerto chosen from:

- F. Küchler Concertino in G major, Op. 15 in the style of A. Vivaldi (transcription for viola of the violin concerto in D major)
- A. Vivaldi Concerto in C major, Op. 7 No. 2 RV 299 (transcription for viola of the violin concerto in G major)
- A. Komarowski Concertino in C major (transcription for viola of the violin concerto in G major)
- O. Rieding Concerto in E minor, Op. 35 (transcription for viola of the violin concerto in B minor)
- O. Rieding Concerto in C major, Op. 34 (transcription for viola of the violin concerto in G major)
- J. Stasica Concertino in C major (transcription for viola of the violin concerto in G major)

The 2nd Group

Stage I

- 1. Freely chosen etude or caprice.
- 2. Miniature accompanied by the piano, with the exclusion of cyclical forms.

Stage II

The 1st or 3rd movement of the concerto chosen from:

- A. Vivaldi Concerto in C major, Op. 3 RV 310 (transcription for viola of the violin concerto in G major)
- G. Ph. Telemann Concerto in G major TWV 51 G9 2nd or 4th movement
- A. Vivaldi Concerto in D minor, Op. 3 No. 6 RV 316 (transcription of the violin concerto in A minor)

The 3rd Group

Stage I

- 1. Freely chosen etude or caprice.
- 2. Miniature accompanied by the piano, with the exclusion of cyclical forms.

Stage II

The 1st or 3rd movement of the concerto chosen from:

- A. Vivaldi Concerto in C major, Op. 3 RV 310 (transcription for viola of the violin concerto in G major)
- A. Vivaldi Concerto in D minor, Op. 3 No. 6 RV 316 (transcription of the violin concerto in A minor)
- G. Ph. Telemann Concerto in G major TWV 51 G9 **two** contrasting movements
- F. Zelter Concerto in E flat major
